

All of the information you will need to keep track of what's going on this session can be found on the Connecticut General Assembly (CGA) website www.cga.ct.gov.

CGA home page highlights:

- **The Bulletin**: The bulletin is updated each day. It includes all of the important activities and information to know during the session including committee meetings, public hearing dates, committee forums and presentations, notes of interest, a schedule of events, and committee assignments.
- CGA Schedule of Events: Shows events (listed monthly, weekly, or daily) at the Capitol and Legislative Office Building (LOB). This is where you will find scheduled public hearings, committee meetings and other events.
- Links to <u>find your legislator</u> by filling in your address, and to the <u>House of</u> Representatives member list and <u>Senate member list</u>.
- **Proposed bills**: At the very bottom is a "bills" icon that allows you to enter in a bill number, which takes you to the bill's webpage. You will find a history of the bill including the proposed text, public hearing and testimony information, and—if it gets that far— its passage to as a Public Act. *If you want to track a specific bill and receive email notifications, click here to register!*
- **Committees**: At the top, committees are listed alphabetically. Each committee page includes their membership (two Senate Chairs and Vice Chairs; one House Chair and Vice Chair), committee meetings, bills reported out of committee, public hearing information, and testimony.
- <u>Citizen's Guide</u>: Visit this page for all you need to know about how to become a part of the process! Learn how to testify at a public hearing, how a bill becomes a law, and much more.
- **Joint Rules**: This legislation sets the rules, or processes and procedures, for both the House and Senate chambers during the session. It includes rules for committees, bills, meetings, public hearings, voting, and more.
